**HARRIS WELCOMES NEWS OF WARNERVALE TOWN CENTRE  
PRELIMINARY WORKS BEGINNING**

**Member for Wyong, David Harris MP, today welcomed news that work will soon begin on earthworks for the long awaited Warnervale Town Centre.**

The Warnervale Town Centre has been planned since the 1970's and many of the residents who moved into the new housing estates in the area have waited and waited for the retail and commercial development to begin.

The new owners of the land have moved quickly to accelerate development of the site which is welcome news for the community.

The work at Warnervale Town Centre builds on recent job creating developments in the Wyong electorate including Tuggerah Lakes Private Hospital, new Ambulance Stations at Hamlyn Terrace and Toukley, a new nursing home at Toukley, new bigger Bunnings at Lake Haven and a new Woolworths at Wadalba.

A new primary school at Warnervale is also in the late planning stages with construction to begin next year.

The new development at Warnervale will have a medical centre, a supermarket, a variety of smaller retailers, offices, a children's play area and a yet-to-be announced child care centre.

"This announcement that earthworks will start on the Town Centre site in the very near future is certainly welcome news for the Warnervale District."

"Our community needs services, jobs and opportunities because the housing development is proceeding at a rapid rate."

"News that the NSW Government is investing \$1.2 million towards water and sewerage is welcome, but there needs now to be serious dollars invested in roads in the Wyong electorate to cope with the growing population and development – the Pacific Highway through Wyong, the Link Road between Watanobbi and Sparks Road, the intersection of Louisiana Roads and Pacific Highway at Wadalba and the Pacific Highway through Charmhaven (including the roundabout near Bunnings) all need funding to cope with the rapid population growth."
